Join the global wave of prayer from 25 May to 4 June

In May last year, many of the churches in England took up the invitation of the Archbishops of Canterbury and York to set aside the days leading up to Pentecost Sunday to pray for the renewing and empowering presence of the Holy Spirit to 'make Christ real in our midst, for the flourishing of all'.

In September 2016, the Presidents of Churches Together in England said, 'we are delighted to join together to extend this invitation to all the churches in England to participate in this movement of prayer in 2017'.

In a joint statement, the Presidents went on to say, 'We want to encourage our brothers and sisters in churches of all traditions to partner in praying 'Thy Kingdom Come' in the days leading up to Pentecost, from 25 May – 4 June.

There is no prescription about how we should pray; we hope each church will participate in a way that is authentic to them and where possible to engage in this with their partner churches in their area.

The aim of 'Thy Kingdom Come 2017' is simple and threefold:

- to join with the whole family of God the Father
- to pray for the empowering of God the Holy Spirit
- that we may be effective witnesses to God the Son Jesus Christ

The statement concludes: 'As Presidents, we will be writing to our churches and congregations to encourage them to share this aim and to take part in this movement. We pray to the Father that his family, called to be one in Jesus Christ, may see the outpouring of the Holy Spirit to transform many lives and communities in our land'.

Taize Gathering: Hidden Treasure

Young Christians from all across Europe coming to Birmingham

Friday 28th April – Monday 1st May

In partnership with the local churches of the city, the Taizé Community will be leading a young adult gathering here in Birmingham. Hundreds of young adults from across the UK and Europe will be travelling here to take part and we hope many young adults from Birmingham's churches will be among those who participate. Brother Alois, prior of the Taizé Community, will take part in the weekend.

The weekend will explore the theme of "Hidden Treasure"; the small and often hidden ways in which Christians are nourishing their faith through prayer, and how their faith is inspiring them to acts of solidarity with those in most need.

An appeal is attached to the invitation to participate:

Bring a Hidden Treasure with you!

In our world of deep divisions, participants in Hidden Treasure are asked to put into practice some new action of friendship or solidarity, and to bring this experience to the event.

The gathering is being held with the encouragement of the presidents of Birmingham Churches Together, Archbishop Bernard Longley, Bishop David Urquhart and Reverend Ian Howarth. Archbishop Bernard Longley, says "We are looking forward to the coming together, a great gathering, we hope and pray, in Birmingham when young people will pick up something of the spirit of Taizé focussing on the central part that Jesus plays in the life of each individual but also within our communities. I know that the churches in Birmingham will benefit tremendously from this wonderful gathering of prayer."

In the wake of a number of international events which have brought to light divisions in our societies, the weekend will celebrate the beauty of the commitment lived out by many Christians and others of goodwill. It is an opportunity to invite those who are exploring or discovering their faith or are struggling with new challenges to come and deepen their faith and engagement. Workshops on Saturday and Sunday afternoon will enable young people to explore themes together and a regular common prayer, open to all, will be at the heart of the weekend.

In a number of host neighbourhoods around the city, people of different churches are working together to prepare accommodation and to prepare a morning programme for participants. Churches of all traditions are already very actively involved in preparing a welcome for those who will come to them. These small acts of trust, such as inviting a stranger into your home stand as a witness to our commitment to live by love rather than fear, and to experience the beautiful exchanges that our openness to the other can make possible.

Responding to the spiritual needs of those affected by cancer:

Almost twenty years ago Professor Ray Donnelly, a Liverpool cancer surgeon, was exploring ways in which to respond to the spiritual needs of those people who are affected by cancer.

A group of like-minded people came together and devised an ecumenical service, PAUSE for HOPE, which has been held annual ever since, alternating between Liverpool's two cathedrals. It has since spread to Chester, Manchester, Glasgow, the Isle of Man and various other centres throughout the country.

RESTORE in 2016: Over the past few years we have seen a significant increase in the number of refugees referred to Restore showing there is a continuing demand for the relational work that we offer to welcome, include and help integrate people who have fled persecution in their home countries and sought sanctuary in the UK. For many years our annual referral rate was around 100 to 115. In 2014 we received 145 new referrals, in 2015 188 new referrals, and in 2016 that increased to 228 referrals of individuals and families - our largest annual figure. During 2016 our referrals included families from the Government's Syrian Vulnerable Persons Resettlement Scheme who had arrived in Birmingham from refugee camps in the Middle East.

We are heartened that Restore has also seen a rise in the number of people from Birmingham offering to volunteer, which has often been a response to the media coverage of refugees fleeing Syria. In 2015 we made 55 new befriending matches. Then in 2016 we set up 88 new befriending matches enabling refugees to receive additional support from a befriender. That support includes help with conversational English, listening, signposting to other services and standing alongside the refugee at this pivotal point in their journey.

Winter Night Shelter

Can you support the night shelter?

The Birmingham Churches Winter Night Shelter is a community of individuals, churches and organisations that work together to provide emergency accommodation, food and support to homeless people in Birmingham during the coldest winter months by welcoming them into our churches and providing hospitality.

This year is our 6th year of running the shelter and we now have 14 churches hosting over 12 weeks from 9th January until 2nd April.

The shelter is a partnership project and relies on an army of volunteers and churches, but it has some financial costs which are necessary for it to run effectively. Thrive Together Birmingham provide the coordination of the project and we have to fund raise for guests transport costs to get them to and from the shelter, and for central coordination costs - we rely on the generous donations of churches and individuals to make the project run.
