It's a Penalty

The West Midlands Violence Reduction Unit and Faith Alliance are partnering with the <u>West Midlands Anti-Slavery Network</u> and campaign charity <u>'It's a Penalty'</u> to help run an anti-trafficking/modern slavery campaign before and during the Commonwealth Games.

Sadly, the risk of human trafficking/modern slavery increases when international sporting events take place. The WMVRU is inviting faith communities in the West Midlands to support the 'It's a Penalty' campaign.

A multi-faith steering group is being set up to explore ways that faith communities can promote the campaign at local level and share awareness-raising materials about spotting and reporting human trafficking.


Healing On The Streets
