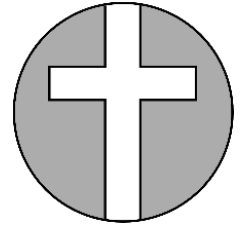

In recent years the SCP, as part of the Body, Mind, Spirit Partnership, has moved from being a service to a participant led approach to activity and aims to enable participation and broaden the range of activities around the interests and skills of local people over 50, reducing isolation and promoting health and wellbeing.

We therefore seek someone who has a heart for people, and will work to establish relationships with local people in Perry Common focusing on the over 50's with a view to enabling them to participate in existing activity and be part of developing new community activities.

The successful candidate will

- support existing activities
- identify and support emerging new activities and share information
- encourage over 50's at risk of isolation to participate in activities that contribute to improving the quality of their lives and the lives of those around them.
